

WELCOME TO OUR CHARMING CITY

The City of Broussard is where Cajun came to be! Early settlers originally named this area Côte Gelée (Frozen Hills) because of its hilly ridge and the severe winter of 1784. Established as a town in 1884, it was named after Valsin Broussard, a prominent merchant and direct descendant of "Beausoleil" Broussard, who lead the first 200 Acadians (later called "Cajuns") to Louisiana from Nova Scotia. Broussard's charming downtown is home to many old historic homes and buildings, 11 of which are listed on the National Historic Register, and the Old Spanish Trail is now our Main Street. Stay in one of our local hotels (Hampton Inn or La Quinta) or bring your RV to Maxie's Campground or Parkside RV Park and explore all that Broussard has to offer.
